WHAT'S NEW IN BLISS WITHOUT RISK (R-R)

We have built a utility zone for our terrain workers in the town Usti nad Labem. In the whole Czech Republic, prostitution is most problematic In this region. A safe place was required for the team, where social workers and health personnel could meet, prepare for work and provide telephone consultations if needed.

We improved the comfort and protection of our employees with new work outfits designed especially for R-R.

We improved the materials we distribute to women in the sex-business, and via the R-R website which is now better structured and more clearly arranged. But more importantly, we have uploaded fundamental information to our Online Counseling Service, which has been welcomed by our clients.

We started to work on renovating the interiors of R-R centers in order to provide more more welcoming spaces for our clients. In 2018, we revamped the R-R centres in Brno and Ceske Budejovice, and we are now preparing for the biggest challenge—the centre in Prague.

The mobile ambulance got a new coat of paint and is now white (instead of yellow). In its new shade the vehicle does not resemble a real ambulance, which sometimes was a problem for club owners (concerned about appearances of and accident or incident on their premises).

We are well aware of the popularity of virtual lives and realities. Online monitoring is already a common practice in our methodology and this year we started to work on web portals which advertise sexual services. We joined various social networks and found websites we did not previously know, e.g. sexworkers' blogs. This enabled us to engaged in online communication directly with women in the sex-business. As a result of this activity, our updated and expanded Online Counseling Service received a large number of enquiries. R-R became member of the Global Network Of Sex Project Organizations. This membership is important to us as it enables us to share our experience and know-how, find inspiration in projects abroad and learn something new.

At AIDS Action Europe conference in Berlin we presented our achievements and, together with the organizations Spolek Ulice Plzen and Network East-West, established a new working group focusing on many issues, but focussing on ensuring the continuity of services provided to women in the sex-business.

Following the example of countries such as France and the U.K., our organization has started to tackle the



issue of decriminalizing prostitution. In the Czech Republic prostitution is not legally regulated and the prevailing attitude is that it should be outlawed. We are focusing on a regulation from 2017, which allows municipalities to ban prostitution in territory under their administration, or create suitable work conditions in a designated area. The aim is to make a municipality legally obliged to create such conditions if prostitution is forbidden in its territory. In order to test this idea, R-R in cooperation with several municipalities launched a pilot project called "Zone Where I Can". This arrangement proved workable in Germany and the Netherlands, and helped to reestablish order in problematic regions.

R-R's principal policy is to promote prevention where repression takes place. We adapt the health services we provide to incorporate the latest advances in medicine. The prospect of a 100% successful cure of chronicle hepatitis C by Directly Acting Antiviral prompted us to encourage all our clients to undergo testing for the infection. We test mainly younger women and especially mothers, whose children would, in most cases, end up in state care if their mother fell too ill to look after them.

OUR ACTIVITIES IN HEALTHCARE

Health protection, not only of our clients but also of the wider public, is one of our core activities. We follow developments and the situation in the area of sexually transmitted infections and diseases (STIs), and we process and analyse the healthcare data we collect. Our main activities are testing for STIs, and informing about prevention against such infections.

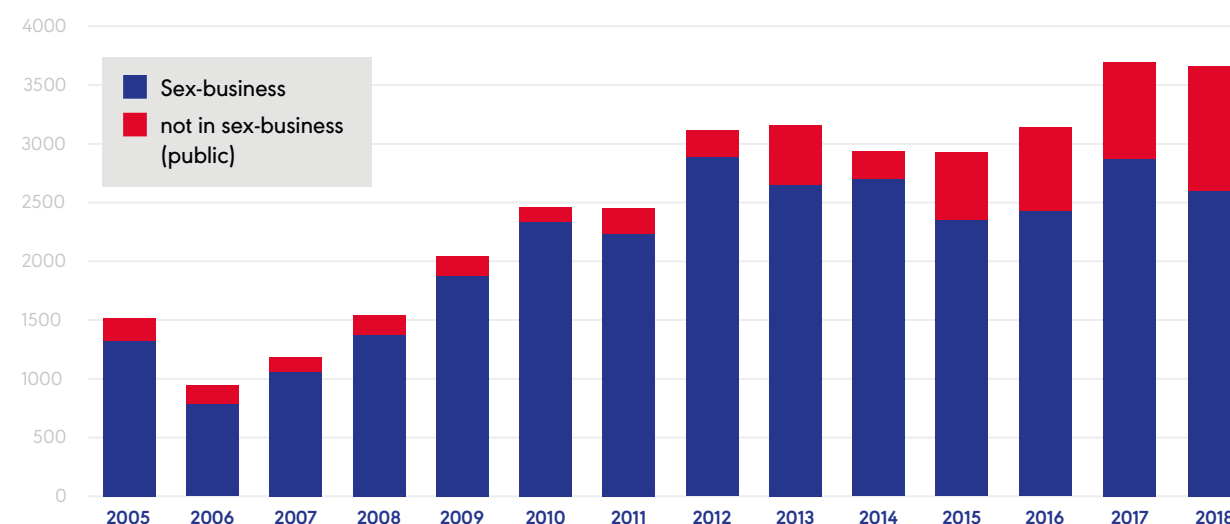

HIV, SYPHILIS, HEPATITIS C

We treat HIV, Syphilis, Hepatitis C as the most threatening diseases and we repeatedly test for these with quick testers as part of our terrain work. In 2018 we did not register a single HIV positive test, and we observed an overall improvement in the epidemiological situation among our clients. In the wider societal perspective, the incidence of HIV infection among women in the Czech Rep. remains very low; in 2018 did not surpass the long-term average infection rate of 23 women per year.

We test R-R clients first and foremost for syphilis and hepatitis C. We carry out the largest amount of testing for TPHA among women in night clubs. On average, we test each client 1.53 times a year, and 1.73 times a year in the South Bohemia region where we registered the highest incidence of syphilis (four acute infections and six cases of latent infection). We test women working in apartments somewhat less due to the difficulties to establish contact. World Health Organization (WHO) recommends testing 4 times a year, but given the migration patterns of the women around all of Europe, this would be very hard to achieve. Under the circumstances, the average of 1.53 tests per woman can be considered a success because in 50 to 60% of testing we are meeting the woman for the first time. Prostitution in the Czech Rep is now largely domestic, with Czech nationals comprising 82% of our clients, 6.4% Ukrainians, and 4.5% Slovaks.

In 2018, we carried out more than double the number of tests for hepatitis C with 1101 tests, compared to 473 in 2017. We recorded 16 cases which we transferred to the appropriate clinics. Drugs use was the prime cause of infection with 85% of new cases citing active or previous intravenous drug use. The hope of a 100% cure from hepatitis C (using the DA A method) provides great hope and help to our clients, especially to the 13 mothers from the 14 Czech women who tested HCV positive.

GONORRHOEA AND CHLAMYDIA

Gonorrhoea is another group of STI's we monitor closely (they cause serious damage to health including infertility and types of arthritis). Among other specifics of this group of STI's is the fact that clients mostly come to us for testing. In 2018, we conducted 603 tests for these STIs, 25% more than in the previous year, and recorded 4 cases.

Chlamydia infections are a big problem in the sex business and is typically the first infection we identify during initial testing of clients. Unfortunately, especially virulent and resistant forms are sometimes identified. In 2018 we conducted 41% more tests for Chlamydia than in 2017. Overall our clients let themselves be tested for chlamydia less often than for other STIs, although an interesting exception are women who work outdoors and undergo testing for chlamydia on average 2.23 times a year; we observe this as a positive result of good contacts between the street workers and R-R staff.

OTHER STIs

This group of STIs are less serious but are relatively wide-spread, and the medical implications thereof are often underestimated by our clients despite the fact that these infections can heighten susceptibility to infection with far more serious STIs. In the long-term, 20 to 25% of our clients are infected with Candidiasis. The women do not voluntarily come to us for preventative testing, but mostly come when health related problems emerge. Treatment of candidiasis is not straightforward: it causes damage to mucus membrane in sexual organs, thus facilitating the penetration of the HIV virus into the organism. We cannot

forget that thorough treatment of all curable STIs significantly reduces the chance of infection with HIV; by up to 42% (UN AIDS findings). More than half of our clients (64%), have bacterial infections. While these infections are common due to frequent and more varied sexual contact, they can and do cause health problems.

TESTING THE PUBLIC

Over the past year we have held 26 campaigns during which we tested a total of 1009 people, 204 more than in 2017. A milestone event was the two days of testing at the Erotica trade show in Prague where we tested a total of 394 people. There was great interest with people queuing to be tested, and our wonderful nurses worked flat out without pause. It is noteworthy that we did not register a single positive test. When asked why they wanted to undergo testing, the attendees cited prevention: "to be certain", being the most common response; "having had unprotected sex", being the second most frequent.

From the statistics we see that more than 50% of those we tested underwent testing for the first time. Given the epidemiological situation in the Czech Republic, this clearly indicates to us that mobile testing is hugely important and worthwhile. As experience from abroad indicates, it is namely prevention that stops increases in growth in the number of people infected.

ACTIVITIES ON SOCIAL NETWORKS

In 2018, our organization worked with 3517 clients, a quarter of whom we established contact for the first time. We started to cooperate with around 70 so called ‘private apartments’, provided a service 4398 times (mostly relating to health, safety and finances), and had 49 therapeutic sessions. We have also managed to increase the number of long-term individual consultations.

Most of our clients—women providing paid sexual services—are of Czech nationality and their average age is 30. Our data shows 65% of them are unmarried and 56% have children, from which 13% have 3 children or more. The most common reason for entering the sex-business is economical; many of the women are in financial dire straits. Only 8% offer their services on the streets, the rest in clubs or ‘private apartments’. We have observed a decrease in usage of illicit class A drugs among our clients.

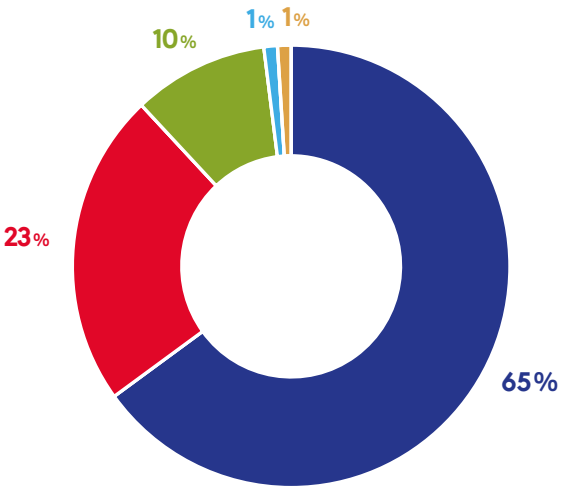
We have come across all sorts of different life stories and the needs related to them. Our clients can be divided into 2 basic groups. Women from the first group identify themselves with the role of a sexworker and want to provide sexual services on a professional level. This type of client uses services related to health (STI check and treatment; personal health counseling including psycho-hygiene) and safety (prevention of violence; dealing with aggressive costumers).

The second group are women who perceive their role as a sexworker as the only way to cope with a difficult life situations (being a single mother; debt trap; seizure of property threat; long-term unemployment, etc.). This group primarily needs specialized social counseling. Apart from personal consultations, we help them with obtaining official documents, finding suitable accommodation and preventing evictions. We provide support when dealing with creditors and a seizure of property, or securing sufficient finances for under-aged children. We help clients deal with violence from a partner (domestic violence), and also to overcome withdrawal symptoms. Our workers accompany clients to wherever it is needed and negotiate legal or a therapist’s help where necessary. We engage organizations cooperating with R-R to help us dealing with these types of problems.



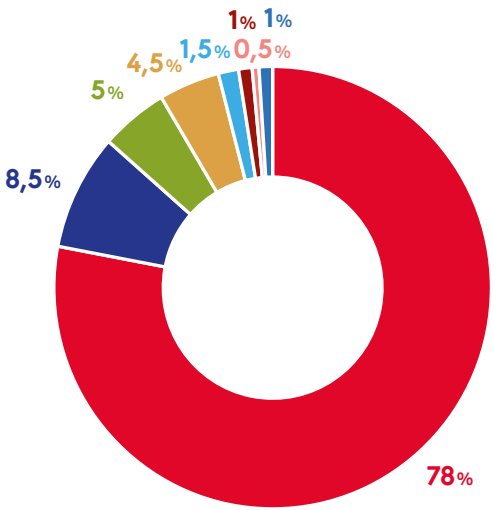

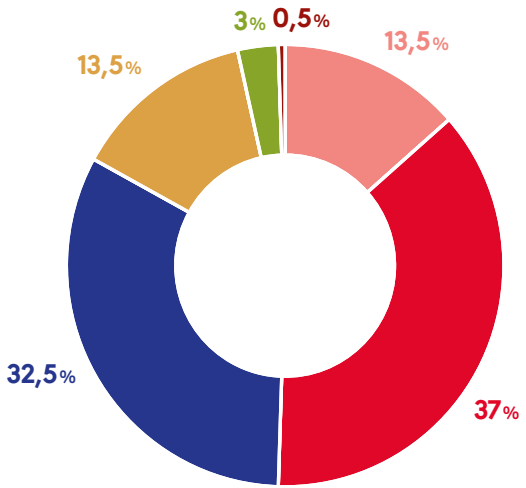

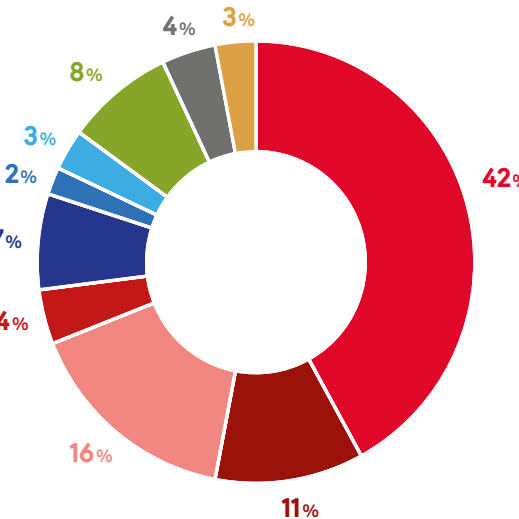

Every woman who uses our services is in an unfavorable social situation. Defining unfavorable social situations depends on the specification of the target group and its needs. The provision of paid sexual services is a very risky job, therefore the main issue for clients is health. Health is a fundamental human value and those exposed to risky behavior are naturally even more concerned than others. Our clients want first of all to be, healthy which means early diagnoses and cure of STIs, and most importantly – prevention from getting infected. Women primarily want to know:

- how to protect themselves from STIs during standard sexual intercourse and also during specific sexual practices, and what means of protection there are (lubrication gels, femidoms, dental masks, etc.)
- how to deal with risks connected to work in sex-business, such as reducing the risk of infection after unprotected sexual intercourse, or after an accident (damage/slip off a condom, oral mask, etc.).

In these cases we usually provide educational preventive counseling and recommend means of prevention, such as a medical examination and consulting, etc.

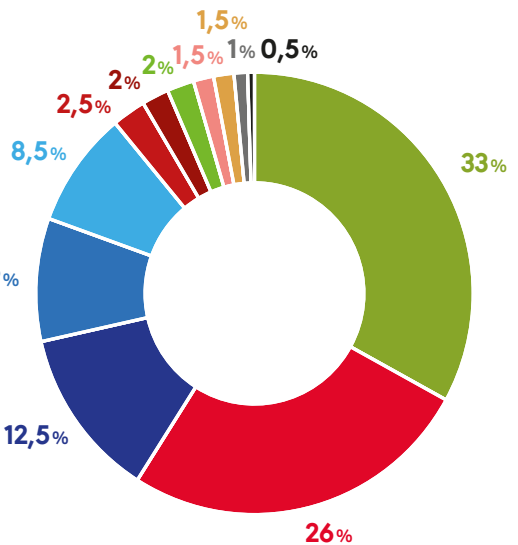
A big part of our social counseling deal with **finances and debts**, and are a significant cause for entering the sex-business and remaining in it. R-R supports women in finding stable income outside of the sex-business and creating and observing a personal economical plan. Clients are informed of the consequences of failing to pay health and social insurance, and about the possibilities of temporary social support. They are motivated to resolve their often critical financial problems and to communicate with authorities dealing with creditors. **Economical and debt counseling, social and legal counseling, and help with finding a stable income outside sex-business are the most common in this area of R-R services.**

The third most frequent problem is **safety**. The most vulnerable group are women entering the sex-business for the first time. They don't know how to set their 'lines' and often allow themselves to be forced into risky behavior, or into withstanding violence from third parts (club owners/managers or even colleagues). **Violence Prevention Counseling** includes simulation of safety-issue situations – how to clarify a deal with a costumer or club owner, to prevent future inconsistency leading to aggression; how to minimize risks connected with offering sexual services on the street or being alone with a costumer; how to defend from being forced into risky sexual practices (sex without a condom, or anal sex). R-R also offers help in crises for victims of physical or sexual violence. A frequently used type of counseling is **advisory on entering the sex-business** and **Psycho-Social Counseling** (development of social and personal skills). In the critical cases we provide legal information for victims of crime.

Our clients often face **relationship problems** in both personal and professional lives, therefore we help them to psychologically cope with working in the sex-business via **Psycho-Social Counseling**/workshops. The aim is to improve clients' job skills and to find a suitable organization for further help. Another problem is an unstable domestic situation which is dealt with in **accommodation counseling**.

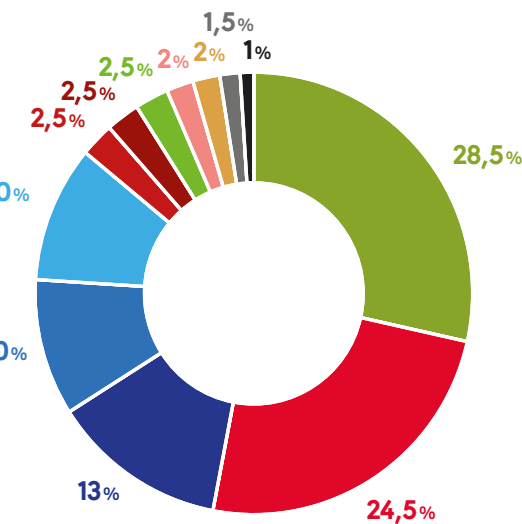

ONLINE COUNSELING

R-R online counselors are an experienced team, each of them having years of terrain work experience. They continually raise their level of qualification by attending various accredited courses and training sessions which focus on issues related to R-R Online Counseling.

Thanks to our online activity, we have at last started approaching women who are afraid to visit us in person, or who are living abroad and seek information how to avoid trouble or need help. There has been a high increase in online inquiries in 2018 – 140 compared with 63 in the previous year.

The most frequent questions concerned health. The second most frequent inquiries concern current legislation. We consult with a lawyer to ensure the information provided is correct. Other frequent inquiries – safe sex, relationships, and issues related to entering or leaving the sex-business.

We have made R-R website more user friendly and updated relevant documents and links. We have closed down the chat box as it did not prove to be a suitable means for long-term communication with clients. The time saved was invested into the Inquiries section.

R-R participated in the 2018 Online Counseling International Conference, which took place in Olomouc under the patronage of the city's Palacky University. The conference brought us new experience and other participants inspired our further development.

R-R LEGAL ADVICE

Until now R-R Legal Advice has been closely tied to a project launched by the Ministry of Justice aimed at helping the victims of crime. While we record crimes and work with victims, we often encounter the problem that women are afraid of reporting a crime due to fear of the perpetrator, but also from fear of their involvement in sex work being exposed. Further, we have experience of women who

have decided to report a crime lose interest once they discover the prospective sentence for the perpetrator.

Usually, the potential for a more severe sentence serves as a demotivating factor. None of the criminal cases with which we have dealt has resulted in an official criminal report being filed, or a criminal investigation being launched.

In three cases, legal representation was arranged. On the other hand, we have provided 700 pieces of legal information to clients, and arranged legal help 11 times. The crimes our clients encounter most often are blackmail, bodily harm and rape.

R-R Legal Advice is also part of our online consultancy services, where it is proving to be very successful. Among the most common questions are: "How can I work legally?", and "What must I do to work legally abroad?". We anonymously publish frequent questions and answers thereto on our portal, where anyone interested can read them.

THEATRE 2018

Rozkoš (Bliss), is an amateur theatre group established to provide therapy and practice job skills for our clients. In 2018 Rozkos performed a new theatre play “Beauty And The Warrior”, which tackles the highly topical and controversial issue of west-to-east migration.

The story starts with Petr and his friends who, bored with their life styles, convert to Islam and travel to areas occupied by Islamic extremists. There is a parallel story about a strip-dancer, Emanuela, who ends up in the harem of a wealthy Arab. The seriousness of their situation is alleviated with humour, and original music and songs, and for the first time in a Rozkoz play - visual & sound effects.

The playwright is the principal of Rozkos and general director of R-R Hana Malinová, and as in all previous Rozkos productions, the composer is Vladimír Pecka.

Beauty And The Warrior was performed 7 times in 2018, of which 3 performances were particularly successful: On the “Mystery” boat (combined with the principal’s birthday celebration); at the ERROR festival (organizers provided excellent conditions); in “Gallery Thirteen” (the cramped space inspired an even better performance).

R-R IN THE MEDIA / FUNDRAISING

Throughout the year we have strongly promoted the subject of predominantly single mothers turning to the sex trade. Thanks to this effort we have received a lot of media exposure, including on the program 168 hours on Czech Television 1, on Michaela Jilkova's debate program on DTV, and on Czech Radio. We also presented our work online in a series of articles on idnes.cz and the server hatefree.cz

Through local media outlets we announced public testing for HIV in the given locality.

The filming of R-R's work on an edition of the program Polosero dedicated entirely to prostitution was a special success. In the programme women spoke about the circumstances that led to them entering the sex business and other mishaps in life, while R-R was presented as a service which provides help and advice namely to women in their situations.

We also promoted our work directly among the public with various excursions including visits to schools specializing in social care. We also attract interest from many foreign students and staff from other organizations. Therefore, to date we have held 23 meetings at various locations the Czech Republic within the framework of what we call R-R Consultation Sessions.

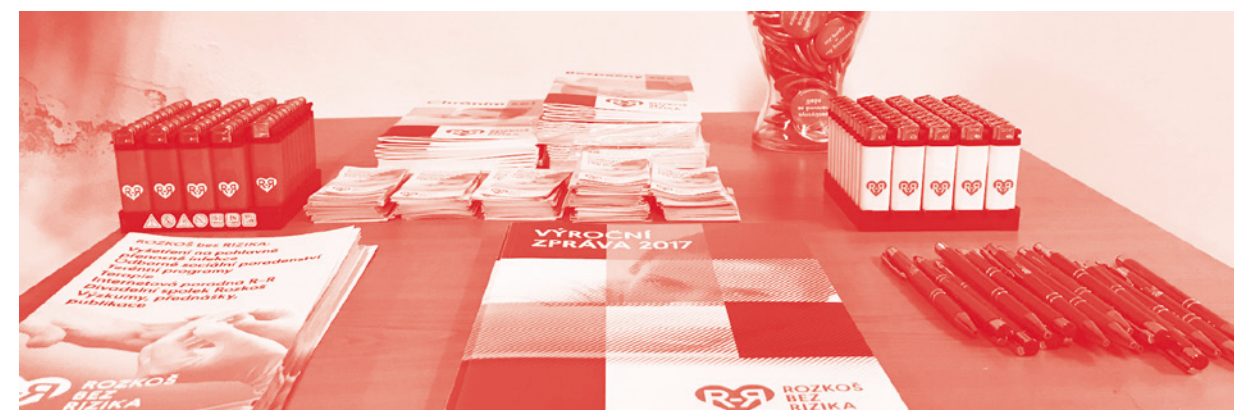
Fundraising for a cause concerning a social taboo and target groups largely unpopular with wider society is not straightforward. It requires a certain measure of patience and it helps to have a talent for negotiations. In the spring we managed to win the support of the largest electronics retailer in the Czech Rep., Alza. Thanks to this we have been able to complete equipping and furnishing of the R-R Centre in Ostrava, and upgrade outdated electronic equipment in the Prague centre.



We have gained some individual supporters who make monthly donations. Our website enables donors to chose specific areas in which their donations are to be spent. In December an alliance of associations in Brno organized a collection of hygienic and cosmetic items for our clients. Thanks to them, over Christmas we were able to distribute presents of tampons, sanitary towels, soaps, creams and other cosmetics to clients in the terrain.

We thank everyone who over the past year gave us a platform and who supported us in any way.

Raising funds for taboo issues and social groups unpopular among the general public is not an easy job. It requires a lot of patience and diplomatic skills.
